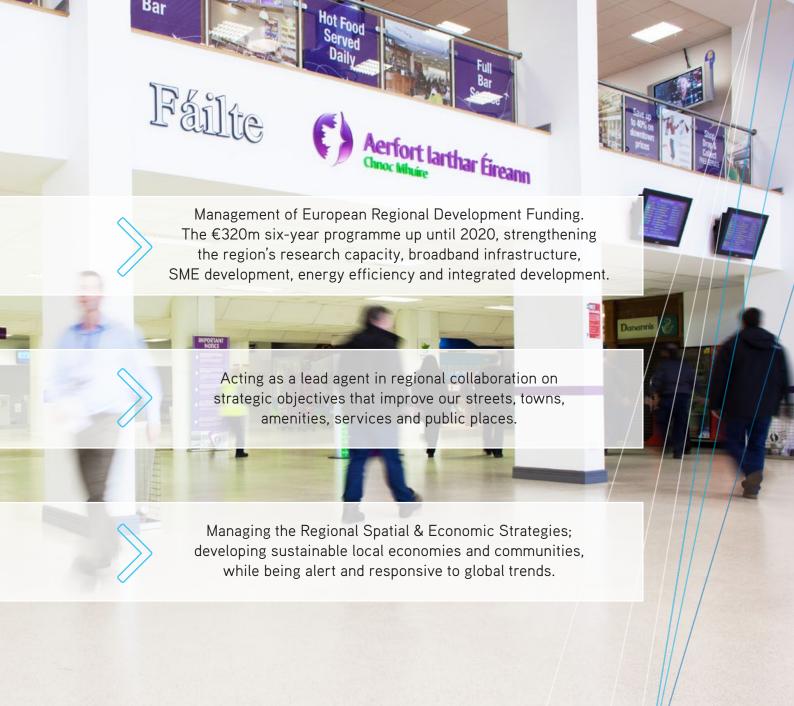

SPARA 2020 - Smart Peripheral

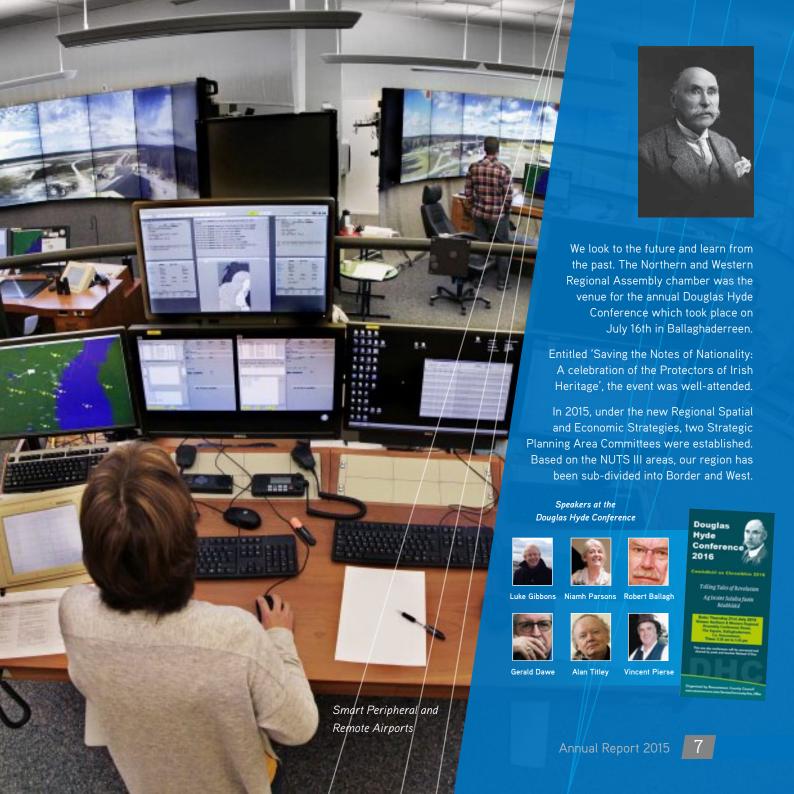

Enhanced Spaces

Providing attractive public spaces and better amenities for people to use and enjoy, can provide very positive impacts.

Under the Designated Urban Centres Grant Scheme, the Assembly in 2015 granted over €14m in funding to seven urban centres in the region, facilitating key projects to go ahead.



€2m directed towards Sligo for enhancements to O'Connell Street and community centre at Cranmore.



€2m dedicated to Letterkenny, improving transport connectivity, road linkage and supporting local social enterprise centre.



€3.5m in Galway towards a City Library and Cultural Centre.



€1.5m in Athlone for Church Street improvement works.



€2 million for Clanbrasil Street and rejuvenation of St Nicholas Quarter in Dundalk.



Mullingar Town Centre: €1.5 million for enhancement of town civic areas and link between them.



Tullamore: €1.5 million for Street Enhancement Project.





Competitiveness: New roles and programmes

The Local Government Act 2014 has introduced a new enhanced role for Regional Assemblies in relation to spatial planning and economic development for regions.

This move was timely as our area of operation is ranked in the bottom third of EU regions according to the European Regional Competitiveness Index. The challenge for the Assembly is substantial but one that can be successfully tackled.

Updates during 2015

- National Spatial Strategy replaced by a National Planning Framework
- Regional Planning Guidelines superseded by the Regional Spatial and Economic Strategies (RSESs) to be developed by the Regional Assemblies
- A new role in linking local economic development with regional and national planning provided to the NWRA through oversight of Local Economic and Community Plans

Northern Periphery and Arctic Programme

The Assembly assisted twelve projects in 2015 across a wide range of sectors including Cruise Tourism, Creative Industries, Renewable Energies, Geo Tourism and Innovation in the Manufacturing sector. Local Authorities in the region continue to support EU Interreg initiatives with participation from Mayo and Donegal Co Councils as well as Sligo Local Enterprise Office, Cavan Innovation & Technology Centre, TEAGASC and the Western Development Commission.





Competitiveness: New roles and programmes

Over 250 delegates from across Ireland gathered in Tullamore in June 2015 to hear the announcement of European Union funded Interreg Programmes which will provide opportunities to Irish organisations to develop interregional co-operation projects throughout Europe up to 2020.

Ireland is eligible to participate in eight Interreg programmes across Europe which have a combined value of €1.3bn in funding assistance from the European Regional Development Fund. Irish Organisations across all sectors are well placed to benefit from the significant funding opportunities available from these Interreg Programmes.

The Programme included contributions from the Directors of the Programmes including the Ireland/Northern Ireland/ Scotland Programme, the Ireland Wales Programme, the Atlantic Area Programme and the Northern Periphery and Arctic Programme.

The Interreg National Information Day was organised in co-operation with Ireland's Regional Assemblies and the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform. The Northern and Western Regional Assembly is the designated National Contact Point for the Atlantic Area and Northern Periphery and Arctic Programmes up to 2020.







Minister English opens **Business Development** Conference

Minister for Skills, Research and Innovation Damien English T.D opened the TESLA Conference on International Business Opportunities funded by the European Interreg North West Europe Programme in NUI Galway in June 2015. Led by the Northern and Western Regional Assembly TESLA supports early stage knowledge-intensive enterprises.

Under the programme over 70 companies have benefitted from specialist international mentor assistance and have been mentored on specific areas of export development, market entry to the UK, Chinese and German markets as well as Strategic Business and Financial Planning. The project also provided assistance to the clients of the Local Enterprise Offices in Longford, Monaghan and Cavan through an Innovation Outreach programme designed to facilitate easier access to the UK market.



Competitiveness: Nurturing New Ideas

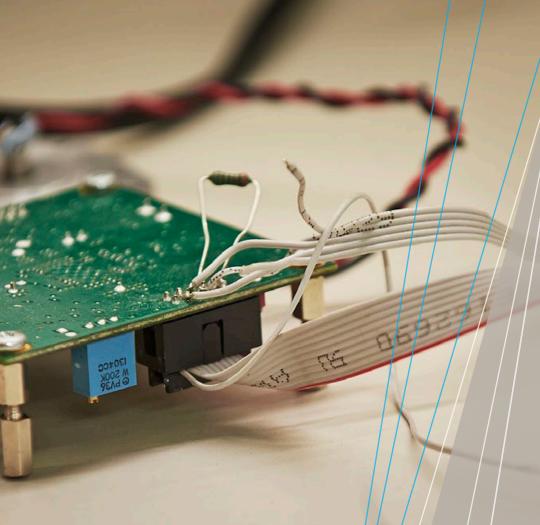
Supporting small business in the region, the Entrepreneurship in Micro Enterprise Scheme, managed by Enterprise Ireland and delivered though the 13 Local Enterprise Offices (LEOs) has significantly enhanced the competitiveness of our SME sector.

Our region has a strong history of research and development (R&D) – the cornerstone of our future. The Assembly channelled funds into regional **Research Technological Development & Innovation (RTDI)** totalling nearly €13m focusing on schemes for research centres, marine research, and commercialisation of research.

In 2015, the Assembly supported 11 applications for Commercial Case Feasibility Support through the Enterprise Ireland Commercialisation Fund.

Competitiveness: Reports and Conferences

HEISME: The Regional Assembly is one of four partners involved in the HEISME project. The other partners are Mid Sweden University, University of Applied Sciences Jyväskylä, Finland and the lead partner on the project the Institute of Technology, Sligo. The aim of the project is to improve entrepreneurial and innovative business through the Higher Education Institutes by providing better supports to start-ups and existing SMEs thus enhancing their competitiveness, sustainability and export potential.



Design-Driven Innovation: Why it matters for SME Competitiveness: This report was launched in March 2015, by Mr. Ged Nash T.D., Minister for Business and Employment. The Assembly was involved in promoting the application of design-driven innovation methodologies to enhance the impact of innovation and innovative ideas in Ireland.

Supporting Public Service Innovation using Design-Driven Innovation: In June, the Assembly took the lead in organising the prestigious Europe-wide SPIDER conference at Dublin Castle. More than 300 delegates gathered to hear stories about smarter cities and towns, public service design and innovations from across Europe. The Assembly coordinated the event's planning and provided support and administration.

The NWRA is one of seven European partners. The project aims to deliver innovative solutions to Europe's toughest social challenges.

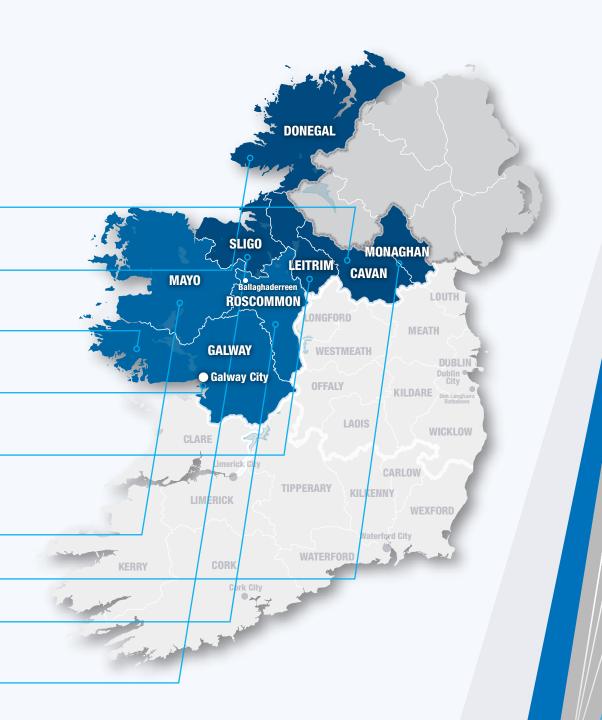

Overview of Energy Usage in 2015

The Northern & Western Regional Assembly occupies one building which it has leased, containing an area of 760m². The energy consumption in our office buildings is for heating, air conditioning, hot water, lighting and office equipment.

The energy consumption in 2015 was 77735 kWh of energy through the use of electricity only. This represents a 16% better performance than the baseline

Actions Undertaken in 2015

Because the Assembly lease its premises we are limited in our capacity to make radical changes. The Assembly registered with the Sustainable Energy Authority Ireland as part of their Energy Advice and Mentoring Programme and continues to monitor the situation. There is a planned phased replacement of older light fittings with new energy efficient lights.
